#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This week is all about setting up SMART Goals that are achievable and rewarding! We will be exploring the important steps of success and how to create inspiration and vision for when we seem to lose sight of a goal that seems impossible.

#### Welcome (5 minutes)

- Welcome
  - o Introduce staff and any guests
  - Overview of meeting/journey

#### Introduction: Goal setting (10-15 minutes minutes)

Setting goals gives you long-term vision and short-term motivation. It helps us stay focused and get more knowledge and skills. They help us make the most of our lives. We are starting a new school year, a new Girl Scout year, it is the end of summer and the start of something new, which is a perfect time to think about goals for the upcoming year.

Has anyone here made goals before? Did you reach them? How did that make you feel? Goals come in many forms, they can be academic, social, or even personal character building goals. We are going to practice choosing, setting, and reflecting on our goals. This is a skill that everyone needs to practice not just adults.

A goal is an outcome, something that will make a difference in the end, it needs to be challenging, but not too hard so you can achieve it, but not to simple that you don't grow in the process.

Why is making goals important? By setting goals, measuring and celebrating reaching goals we are able to see what we have done and what we are capable of. Seeing our results give us the confidence and assurance that we need to reach higher goals.

#### **SMART Goals**

Setting goals can be a difficult job, we usually are pretty vague about the goals,

"I want to read harder books." That is a good goal but how do you reach it?

- 1. Specific: What exactly do you want to accomplish?
  - a. I want to read a chapter book on my own.
- 2. Measurable: How will you know when you meet your goal?
  - a. I will have read the book.

- 3. Attainable: Three steps I will take to accomplish this goal?
  - a. Pick a book out
  - b. Read a page every day.
  - c. Write words I don't know down to look up
- 4. Relevant: This goal is important to me because ...?
  - a. I want to read more stories
- 5. Timely: What is the deadline you set to meet your goal?
  - a. By next Christmas.

#### Activity One: Shaping Your Goals (10 minutes)

Materials: Piece of paper, SMART Goal Worksheet, Pencil, things to color with

We all have very many different goals depending on what we are trying to accomplish. Some goals are really small- while some goals might take an entire life time to complete. We are all going to shape out a SMART goal that we would like to achieve- maybe something this school year, before we graduate high school, or perhaps a dream job. Be optimistic and excited to start and finish your goal that you set.

Specific: What is your Specific Goal?

Measurable: How can you check in and measure that it's going according to your plan?

Attainable: What steps will I need to take to get this Goal completed?

Relevant: This goal is most important to me because...: Am I going to need some help?

Timely: How long will this goal take? What is my deadline?

#### Activity Two: Success-Berg (10-20 minutes)

Materials: Dark blue/Light Blue/White Construction Paper, Scissors, Tape, Glue, Marker or things to write with. Instructor- you are encouraged to cut the paper prior to the start of the program into light blue and dark blue paper into triangles and squares.



Just like an iceberg- almost all of the hard work that goes into making us successful at accomplishing our goal will go unseen. What are some of the things that people "don't see" when we are achieving success? Do any of the words in the pictures remind you of a moment in your own experience working towards a specific goal? Maybe you had to miss a movie night with friends because you had a soccer tournament. Or maybe you think of all the homework you had to do before getting an A on the spelling test last week. While we set goals for

ourselves- it's important that we see the value of the discipline and time we use towards that success in our goal. Our hard work won't be understood or seen by other people most of the time- not always though, usually our supporters like parents, coaches and teachers see some of these moments- but not all. To remember and visualize all the pieces of our Goal's Success, we are going to create our own Success-bergs art.

First we are going to use our white construction paper as our canvas. Do the best you can to draw the shape of an iceberg (like the one in the photo) with only some of the top above the water and a large point bottom under the water. At this point, we can add our water line showing waves.

Participants are to cut a few long strips of the light blue and dark blue paper. Once into a few strips- not the whole sheet- always can add more. Next cut the strips into squares and triangles at random. Depending on the size of your iceberg is how much paper you will use. For the one featured in the photo- about a half of each color sheet was used. We are going to use glue or tape to make an iceberg collage. Once all the pieces of triangles and squares are added to the outline of your iceberg- we are going to cut off the excess white canvas so only the shape of our iceberg remains. On the top of our iceberg- we are going to write "SUCCESS" in big letters. If you would like- add two thin pieces of blue paper strips to show were the water line is if you are unable to see it now with the triangles.

Next, use your coloring tools to add words like "hard work, struggles, failures, dedication, practice" to the bottom of your iceberg that is under the water.

Think of the words that describe all the steps to success people don't see. Persistence, dedication, hard work, struggles, discipline, failure, risk, practice, sacrifice.

#### Activity Three: Vision Pages (20 minutes)

Materials: Construction Paper, Magazines, Quotes, Stickers, things to color with, scissors, glue.

A vision page is a way to document your goals, dreams and things that inspire you in a picture or poster. What goes on your vision page is entirely up to you. It should be positive and inspiring visual picture of what you want to do and get this year. Some people use a vision page or board to document their goals and intentions, for others it is a place to capture happy thoughts and images. It is important to have the visualization while you are working toward your goals. A vision page or board is a method to visualize those goals.

What you put on the vision page is up to you but remember you are using this to inspire and motivate you, you have free reign. BE CREATIVE. BE YOU. Getting started:

Gather all your art supplies, have a place for your garbage scraps if you are using magazines to cut out images. Think about what goals you had made using SMART, these are what you want to visually represent on your vision board. Cut out photos that you like even if you aren't 100% sure you will use them. It is better to have more than you need before you make the final selection.

Once you have all the pictures/words/stickers you want to use it is now time to fill up your page- you may decide that you need to use two. That is 100% totally cool. Make this your board, your vision. You are going to want to place them where you want them before actually gluing them down. You will want to make sure you like the placement before making it permanent. Once you have everything where you want it, start gluing. You can fill in the blank spaces with hand drawings or writing. Or keep looking for smaller pictures/stickers. Everyone's is going to look different, some will be really organized, some will be all words, and some will be completely full and look busy. They are all going to be great! You can always add to your board as you work toward the goal. Save memories here along the way as you venture to accomplish what you put your mind to!

After a few moments of creating we will take a few moments to let some friends share their vision pages before we clean up.

### **Smart Goals**

A trick to help you accomplish a goal is to write it down as a SMART Goal.

A SMART Goal is: Specific, Measurable, Actionable, Relevant, and Time-Based.

#### **Snowball Ice Cream**

#### **Supplies Needed:**

- Snowball Ice Cream flyer
- 1/4 cup of half and half
- 1/4 cup of milk
- 1 tablespoon of sugar
- 1 teaspoon of vanilla
- · 1 sandwich bag
- 1 gallon-sized bag
- Salt
- Gloves
- Sweetened coconut flakes (optional)
- Favorite ice cream toppings (optional)





#### **Instructions:**

Refer to the Snowball Ice Cream flyer for step-by-step instructions on how to make your own ice cream. Be sure to talk amongst the troop about how it works!

Plan a date with the girls to have a DIY snowball ice cream party to celebrate the end of the program.





#### SNOWBALL ICE CREAM

A Delicious DIY Activity

#### What you need:

1/4 cup of half and half

1/4 cup of milk

1 tablespoon of sugar

1 teaspoon of vanilla

1 sandwich bag


1 gallon-sized bag

Salt

Winter gloves or mittens

Sweetend coconut flakes (optional)

Favorite ice cream toppings (optional)



#### **Directions:**

- 1. Put the first four ingredients in a sandwich bag
- 2. Close the sandwich bag securely
- 3. Put ice in your gallon-sized bag (approximately 3 cups worth)
- 4. Put salt in your gallon-sized bag (approximately 3 tablespoons or more)
- 5. Place sandwich bag in a gallon-sized bag
- 6. Put on your gloves
- 7. Shake and/or massage the bags for 5-7 minutes.
- 8. Enjoy!

#### Optional to make a "snowball":

- 1. Line a baking sheet with parchment and put the baking sheet in the freezer. Scoop the ice cream you just made into a ball and place on the baking sheet in the freezer. Be careful not to touch the ice cream to the salty water or bags.
- 2. Freeze until it becomes solid.
- 3. Place the coconut in a bowl. One at a time, roll the ice cream balls in the coconut. Gently press the coconut into the ice cream. Return the snoball to the baking sheet in the freezer.
- 4. Once all of your snowballs are decorated you can servce immediately. If desired, serve with your favorite ice cream toppings!

#### How Does It Work?

Shaking the bag mixes the ingredients and also keeps them moving around next to the cold ice water. Regular ice is not cold enough to freeze the ice cream ingredients. When salt is added to the bag with the ice, the salt causes the ice to melt and the freezing point of the water is lowered enough to make the cream mixture freeze. Make sure to keep shaking the bag gently so it all freezes evenly. You should be able to see the change as it happens. After just a few minutes... Voila! You'll have created your own delicious homemade ice cream!





Draw the beak.



Draw the head.




**Step 4:** Draw the body and tail.





Draw one side view of foot.




Step 6:

Draw the other foot.





#### Color Patch Design Art Pages


#### **Supplies Needed:**











# **5 SKILLS** to enhance your **FALL FUNDRAISER PROGRAM**

#### **GOAL SETTING**

- Decide on a goal
- Write it down
- · Tell someone so they can help you reach your goal
- · Break down your goal into smaller goals
- · Plan your first step
- · Don't give up
- CELEBRATE; even if you don't reach your initial goal, take pride in what you accomplished

#### **Decision Making**

- Girls learn to make decisions on their own and as a team.
- During the program, there will be many decisions to make that will guide you toward reaching your goal. To start, you will need to decide which friends and family to contact and how best to contact them: in person, by phone or email, text messages, or on social media.
- What actions will you take to maximize your results after that?

#### **Money Management**

#### **Business Ethics**

Girls learn to act ethically, both in business and life.

As you prepare to ask friends and family to support their efforts in the Fall Fundraiser Program, contact their potential customers respectfully and in a timely manner.

Plan to share why the troop is earning money and what the troop intends to do with the proceeds earned. Any questions they are asked should be answered honestly and thoughtfully.

Also, a "thank you" goes a long way. Make sure to say thank you to those who are supporting you. Customers need to know that they are appreciated when they make a purchase that benefits the girl and her troop. Be prepared by completing each of these tasks:

- •Practice what you will say to customers as you ask for their support
- •Create thank you notes or personalized emails to share with those you contact, even if they do not make a purchase from you

#### **People Skills**

#### Girls find their voice and build confidence through customer interactions.

#### **Blubber Gloves**

#### **Supplies Needed:**


- Blubber Gloves flyer

- Latex gloves

- Stopwatch




#### **Instructions:**

Blubber is the fat that is found on the Emperor Penguin and many other sea mammals. It's an important part of their anatomy. It stores energy, insulates heat, and increases their buoyancy.

Using the Blubber Gloves flyer, follow this cool experiment to learn what penguin blubber may feel like. Check out the science behind how the Emperor Penguins stay warm in the harsh, cold, southern hemisphere!








Ever wonder how penguins stay warm in the cold southern hemisphere?

Check out this experiment to feel the blubber effect for yourself!

#### What You Need:

- Shortening
- Latex gloves
- Ice
- Water
- Freezer
- Large Bowl
- Stopwatch



BLUBBER GLOVE

#### **Directions:**

#### Step 1:

Place a large bowl with water and ice in the freezer for 5 minutes.

#### Step 2:

Have each girl take turns, putting their hands in the water. Using the stopwatch, time how long before their hand becomes uncomfortable and cold in the water.

#### Step 3:

Once all the girls have timed themselves, have each girl take a latex glove and put it on one of their hands. Cover the glove with the shortening.

#### Step 4:

Place the gloved hand covered in shortening into the freezing water. Again, time how long it takes to feel uncomfortable and cold in the water.

The girls will notice that the shortening acts as an insulator for protecting their hands from the cold of the icy water. This is similar to how the Emperor Penguins have their thick feathers and blubber under their skin. Feathers work great on land, but not as well as blubber to keep them warm in the cold ocean. This is where their blubber layer comes in handy! Pretty cool.... right?
